(Caracara plancus) band code "CRCA"




The Crested Caracara looks like a hawk with its sharp beak and talons, behaves like a vulture, and is technically a large tropical black-and-white falcon.



GOOD NEWS IN COASTAL CONSERVATION

Due to shifting sand, some new low lying islands emerged this spring in Nassau Sound resulting in new opportunities for nesting shorebirds. The FWC included these new islands in the North Sound Critical Wildlife Area. "No Boat Landing" signs were posted, and despite some erosion and storms, by mid August 2022 more than 12 Gull-billed Terns and 30 Black Skimmers had fledged. Page 2 of 4

The Lake City Treatment Wetlands, opened in 2016, is a series of nine wetland cells constructed to treat Lake City wastewater. We hope to see a plethora of waterfowl, wading birds, and perhaps some rarities as we walk the dikes separating the cells. This is a GREAT opportunity because this site is not open to the public.

Please don't be late! The gate will be closed after we enter the site.

Meet trip leader Debbie Segal in the parking lot of Hitchcock's grocery store on US-441 in Alachua to carpool to the treatment wetlands near Lake City (you can also meet us at 8:30 at the SS Food Store a block west of I-75 at Exit #423).

Difficulty: 1

Within easy access to the vehicle and/or level terrain; 1 mile or less.



BIRDING ETHICS (including photography)

Practical guidelines that aim to mitigate the stress birds and their habitats face when humans intrude.

- Leave pets home
- Bring binoculars
- Mute cell phones
- · Gently close vehicle doors
- · Talk softly/whisper
- Keep bird call playback and pishing to a minimum.
- Walk quietly in woods (pick up feet)
- · Avoid using a flash when taking photographs
- Keep your distance
- DO NOT flush or disturb birds (especially during spring nesting season)
- · Stay on established trails
- Be alert for bird sounds/movements
- Coughing/sneezing? Stay away from group or, if possible, in vehicle
- Respect other birders
- Wear earth tone color clothing, when possible
- · Stay hydrated and safe
