





\$1.4 MILLION AWARDED IN AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL CHALLENGE GRANT

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation awarded the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF/FAS), Archbold Biological Station and Conservation Florida, roughly \$1.4 million in grant funding for a groundbreaking collaborative project to enhance wildlife habitat in the Northern Everglades as part of the America the Beautiful Challenge.




SPEAKER SERIES PROGRAM MAY 14 Bees has been CANCELLED

Tree Fest is an annual event presented by Solar Impact and hosted at Swamp Head around Earth Day and Arbor Day to support the Alachua Conservation Trust by raising money to plant a lot of trees.

How does it work?

Tree Fest plants four trees for every beer purchased during the day. Trees will also be planted for merchandise purchases. All donations from Tree Fest sponsors go directly to tree plantings.

Trees are one-year-old longleaf pines. They are planted by the Alachua Conservation Trust at the Little Orange Creek Preserve in Hawthorne, FL.
